In this article, Monica Ali, 37, who has contributed a chapter entitled "Brick Lane" to the book <u>Weekenders: Adventures</u> in Calcutta, talks to Ann McFerran from The Sunday Times

- -1- GOWING UP in Bolton, as part of an immigrant community- the daughter of an English mother and a Bangladeshi father- I didn't really go on holiday. Later, when I was a teenager, I'd tag along with some English school friends going on summer hols with their families to Lake District, or Whales, or even as far afield as the Dordogne.
- -2- But at university and in my twenties I went to most countries in Europe, as well as to India and the USA. I'd go somewhere different each time, sometimes on my own, sometimes with a friend. And I wanted to learn as much about a place as possible -reading about it and doing a lot of sightseeing, so I'd really get a sense of people and the culture.
- -3- Mostly I'd splash out on really nice holidays for a few nights. Egypt was particularly thrilling; because I'd seen so many pictures of the pyramids atschool, I almost couldn't believe I was really seeing them. We also stayed by the Red Sea, and then took trips to the desert -we even spent a night camping in the moonscape.



- -4- Istanbul, too, was stunning. All those clichés about how East meets West are true. I loved everything about it, and especially the souks. I hate shopping in England, but Istanbul, with its rugs and its jewelry, is different matter.
- -5- After I graduated I went to India with a friend for several months. As with the pyramids, I found that actually seeing the TajMahal is so astonishing, it makes you catch your breath. We did long overnight train journeys to Calcutta and Orissa, and what's so fantastic about those train journeys is how you can see the whole Indian life style from the train: people getting up in the morning, washing, feeding their children, conducting their entire lives. It's a complete sightseeing experience in itself



-6- Just before Brick Lane was published, I wanted to go back to Bangladesh with my husband to see where I was born. But I couldn't get a visa -it was a big blow at the time, but I'm still hoping that I'll be able to someday. A two-week holiday in Cape Town was the consolation prize. I was very excited about going to Africa, but Cape Town didn't really seem like Africa at all -more like an enormous theme park for white people. Of course, parts of America are like that, too. Cape Town is a place of extremes, of the very rich and the very poor, but the scenery is immensely awe-inspiring.
