The text:

1-The concern over immigration is fuelled in part by two conflicting fears. Illegal immigrants are vulnerable to exploitation by employers and often victimized-kidnapped, tortured and sometimes killed by criminals and smugglers. At the other extreme, in cities like los Angeles, <u>they</u> flood labor market and set off bitter competition with American workers and legal immigrants for jobs.

2-Much as Americans tend to regard immigrants as poor, uneducated and less skilled, **the vast majority** are surely enterprising. What they seek is opportunity. The opportunity to hold jobs that no American wants, to buy a T.V. set and a car, to start a new family and invest in the next generation. Integration is for the young. It takes money and determination to pull up the roots, say good-bye to all that is dear and familiar. Illegal immigration with all its hazards is for the truly daring.

3-The law to stop immigration created in 1965 recognizes three reasons to award visas: job skills, a demonstrable reason to seek refuge from war or political persecution and kinship to an American citizen or a legal alien. This triad of goals replaced the national origin system of 1924 which favored immigration anywhere else.

4-And the law is full of holes. Some immigrants game the system by forging documents and paying American lawyers to make <u>them</u> eligible American visas and green cards. This is known as adjusting status and in most years it works for more than 200,000 immigrants.
